Suffering from job loss or loss of income? Don't wait to get the help you need. Get organized and take action to get available help now.

1. Assess Your Finances

- a. If you have lost your job or have had your hours reduced due to COVID-19, apply for unemployment. This program has been expanded to meet the needs of COVID-19 job losses. <u>Click here.</u>
- b. Determine other benefits you can receive such as <u>SNAP</u>. Previously called food stamps, it helps pay for groceries.
- c. Determine if you can defer any bills utilities and other companies might have programs in place for COVID-19/ Coronavirus relief)
- d. Write down all the expenses that you still will owe month to month and update your budget. Non-profit financial counselors are available to assist at <u>www.nfcc.org</u>
- e. If loss of childcare has impacted your ability to get to work and you are an essential job – <u>search here</u> for those still providing childcare.

Assistance is available for essential needs such as:

<u>SNAP</u> - Previously called food stamps, this program helps pay for groceries.

WIC - Help with healthy food for children & pregnant women

Food Pantries - Many area pantries are still operating

Medical Insurance: <u>Medicaid</u> - Low income, full coverage health insurance. Income too high? Click here for <u>Health</u> <u>Insurance Marketplace</u>

2. Emergency Rental Assistance

Contact your landlord to explain how your income has been affected by the Coronavirus pandemic and inquire if they are offering a rent reduction or deferment for those affected.
