

When a Housing Forward client gets the keys to their new home, they're often moving in with nothing but the clothes on their back.

You can help ensure that every individual and family has what they need to turn an empty apartment into a home. **House to Home Kits** provide household essentials that support a fresh start and a stable transition out of homelessness.

#### **HERE'S HOW IT WORKS:**

**Gather Volunteers (optional)** Form a group to collect household items (list on the back page). This is a great project for small groups; congregations, coworkers, friends, or neighbors.

**Collect the items** Use the provided list to gather all required household items. Suggested stores include Target, Walmart, Amazon, and similar retailers.

Move items into the apartment (optional) Your group can help set up the apartment and move in the items you purchased. Tasks may include cleaning, stocking cabinets, unpacking supplies, and writing a "welcome home" card.

\*A television can be more than just entertainment- it helps clients reconnect with the world around them, stay informed, and feel a sense of normalcy. For many moving into housing after a period of homelessness, it also provides comfort and companionship during the adjustment to living alone. We ask that the TV is no less than 42" inches.

## Why are we asking for new items rather than gently used?

Clients leaving homelessness are starting over in a new space, often with limited personal belongings. Providing **new** items allows them a fresh start, and helps reinforce that they are valued and deserving of the same respect as anyone else.
